



## Educational Justice Grants

Justice Grants are occasionally available to LoyalTeach students who are unable to pay the cost of an essential educational opportunity or who face unexpected or unreasonable one-time costs for educational commitments they have already made. They are not intended to provide an annual source of college funding. Grants may be made to help students pay for items like the following:

- Travel to visit one or more colleges a student has been admitted to, or for a placement exam
- A deficit in college funding as the result of the loss of a scholarship to a student who is progressing appropriately toward graduation
- A non-refundable deposit to a college lost because of inadequate financial aid information provided by the college at the time the deposit was due

Who is eligible to apply: Any registered LoyalTeach student

When to apply: Grants are considered on an as-needed basis; there is no application deadline

Expectations: Applicants must provide a copy of their school transcripts and federal student aid reports, if available, as well as documentation of their accumulated student debt and of their families' educational spending and expected educational expenses for the current academic year. Applicants whose spending and expected expenses do not exceed their estimated financial contribution as reported on their student aid reports will generally be ineligible for a grant. Applicants should also provide evidence of consideration of other means of potential support (for instance, travel assistance from a college).

Amount and determination of award: Dependent on need and availability of funds; determined by the selection committee
